The Bulletin in Brief

This last issue of the Bulletin for 2013 contains five articles, including three on arbitration rules, as well as ten court decisions.

First, *Ingeborg Schwenzer* and *David Tebel* analyse **arbitration**, **choice of forum and choice of law clauses under the CISG** and in particular recent suggestions that the freedom of form principle under Art. 11 CISG extends to such clauses.

Luca Beffa then examines the issue of **enforcement of "Default Awards"** and provides practical advice for Claimant seeking to enforce such awards.

The following three articles analyse various rules. *Julia Salasky* and *Corinne Montineri* present the **UNCITRAL Rules on Transparency in Treaty-Based Investor-State Arbitration**, which will, once in force on 1 April 2014, will be the most comprehensive set of procedural rules in existence governing transparency in treaty-based investor-State disputes. *Franz T. Schwarz* and *Christian W. Konrad* introduce the revised **Vienna Rules** (as well as a preview of the new **Austrian arbitration law** 2014) and *Olivier Caprasse* and *Charles Price*, the new **CEPANI 2013 Arbitration Rules**.

A summary of ten court decisions (including nine from the Federal Supreme Court) published in this issue is set out in the Introduction to the **Case Law** Section (p. 818), including the following decisions:

- Two Supreme Court decisions dealing with requests for revision of the arbitral award, both rejected;
- Four Supreme Court decisions, including two on the application to set aside CAS/TAS awards, reviewing alleged violations of due process and/or of a party's right to be heard (alleged surprise application of law, breach of procedural rules pertaining to joinder of proceedings, lack of reasoned award, rejection of witness evidence):
- A decision of the Paris Court of Appeal, with an article from Carine Dupeyron and Flore Poloni, "Procédure de liquidation d'une partie, arbitrage et droit d'accès à la justice: vers une réconciliation?".

Also included in this issue are news about ASA, in particular the Minutes of the General Meeting of 4 October 2013, including a report on the

elections of the new ASA President (Elliott Geisinger) and the new ASA Board, as of 1 January 2014.
