I have therefore created a bi-monthly publication, World Trade Materials, which will be published every January, March, May, July, September and November, and will provide the much needed complement to the original articles in the Journal of World Trade. I am convinced that this new journal will prove to be a valuable working tool and would like to recommend it to you all.
